EC79/24. To receive apologies for absence

RESOLVED: None

EC80/24. To receive and approve for signature the minutes of the meeting held on Thursday 18th January 2024 (APPENDIX A)

RESOLVED: That the minutes of the meeting held on Thursday 18th January 2024 were approved as a true record and duly signed by the Chair.

EC81/24. To receive declarations of interest under the Council's Code of Conduct related to business on the agenda

Members were reminded of the need to declare any interests in the items on this agenda, whether pecuniary or otherwise. There were no interests declared.

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EC82/24. Public Participation Session

• There were no members of the public present.

EC83/24. Limehurst Square

- Due to recent crime events in Limehurst Square, Councillors have raised concerns over the current CCTV provision. The Clerk noted that a majority of the businesses in the square operate their own CCTV, but theft and crime sill persist.
- The Chair also highlighted concerns about potential, but not reported, increase in antisocial behaviour from young people due to the Parish installing benches at the Square.
- The Committee discussed that whilst CCTV can be useful in the fight against crime and anti-social behaviour it doesn't eliminate it.
- The point was made that CCTV can play a role in reducing the fear of crime and so making people more safe.

RESOLVED:

- a) That the Clerk contacts the local policing team and Sharon Henley, the Designing Out Crime Officer for information to support the proposal to install CCTV cameras around Limehurst Square.
- b) That the Clerk investigates the following proposals:
- A Cricket: A device that plays a high-frequency that only young people can hear to repel them from loitering.
- A speaker to play Jazz: As young people don't like Jazz it.

The Clerk highlighted concerns with both noise related proposals due to residential dwellings being located above the shop.

EC84/24. Mendip Park Entrance

- The Committee noted whilst the new soakway was working flooding at the entrance still remained a problem after heavy rain fall. Various solutions was discussed.
- RESOLVED: That the Clerk contacts the contractor used to install the soakaway to seek suggestions on how to mitigate the flooding further and to seek a potential flooding consultant for input.

EC85/24. Streetlighting

RESOLVED: To discuss how to proceed with possible streetlights in the following areas:

- Meeting Lane (including the alleyway with Sycamore Road): That Cllr Liddon
 Contacts the Boys Brigade to enquire about the feasibility of installing lighting on the
 HQ building.
- Cllr Enright-King and Cllr Ingram will look into a light at the Conservative Club.
- Ashtree Way near the Bakery: That the Clerk contacts the bakery to enquire about the feasibility of installing lights on their building to cover the alleyway.

At a later date the Committee will then consider

- Alleyway from Southfield Road to Dover Court (Upton): The Clerk will in the meantime we again try to investigate using "Safer Routes To Schools". Previously no response was forthcoming.
- Alleyway between Brockwood Close and Limoges Ct

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

Hello,

In preparation of a forthcoming Environment Committee I have asked NCALC about parish council powers in respect of enforcement:

Thank you for your enquiry. Parish councils can use power under the Environmental Protection Act 1990, s.88 to issue fixed penalty notices for litter offences in the council's area. I don't know of any parish council's currently using this power and have asked Danny and Lesley if they are aware of any.

With regards parking, the unitary authority is responsible for all highways matter, including parking. Parish councils have the power to provide and maintain suitable off-street car parking places (Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, s.57(1)(b)) and to regulate the use of car parks and charge for their use (RTRA 1984, ss.59(3), 35(1).

So legally speaking a parish council can issue Fixed Penalty Notices (FPN) for some environmental offences. However, to do this you would need to employ trained staff or get a specialised contractor to do this. Since patrolling and issuing FPN is a labour intensive activity if we were to go down this road then it would be a significant budgetary cost to the Council. I assume this is why so few parish councils actually do this in practice. I am not putting councillors off the idea in considering this but just making you fully aware. According to NCALC parish councils have no power to enforce the highway code and traffic offences with FPN.

I have asked about who is the WNC Neighbourhood Ward for the Duston area? Could we ask them to come into our area for a while. They have the powers to issue FPN for environmental type crime like littering. I have received the replay from WNC

In short we don't currently have a list of wardens allocated to parishes that we can share, it changes all the time at the moment as we are short staffed and keep getting pulled in to other projects etc.

The best way to contact them is via enverime@westnorthants.gov.uk then we can get someone out to them depending on their issues. As we have such a small resource now

across whole of west we are having to make some difficult decisions about where we deploy and what we can get involved in.

I would urge whoever is experiencing the problems to report them through; using the online forms and the Report It app. We prioritise where we deploy based on the number of reports we receive and the general need of the area. Whilst wardens do still patrol areas to identity issues themselves, it's based on need, so if we don't know there are issues they won't get much resource......

We are currently looking to engage a new environmental enforcement contractor who will operate across the whole of the west so again, if we know about specific issues we can look to deploy appropriate resource.

I hope that helps. Please encourage reporting."

Therefore they do not currently have capacity due to staffing shortages for us to be able to hire them.
